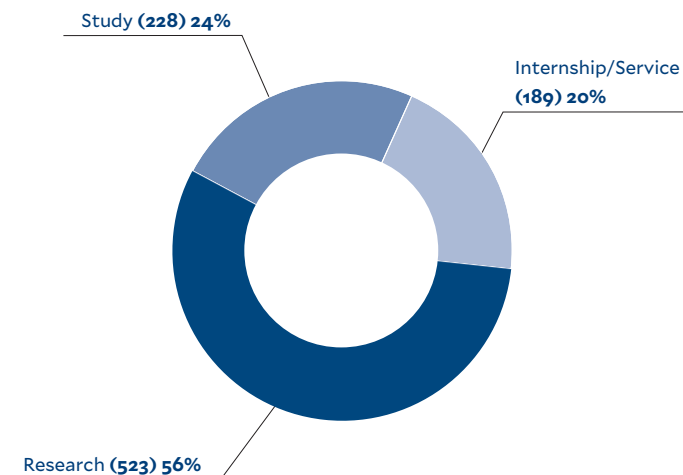

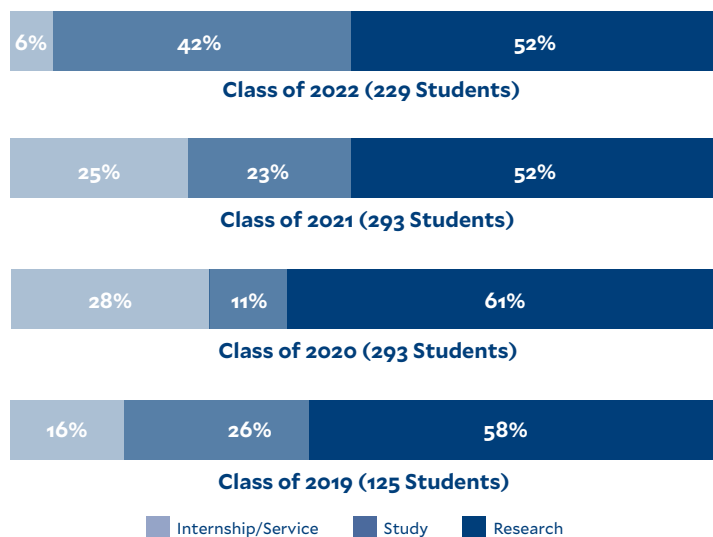

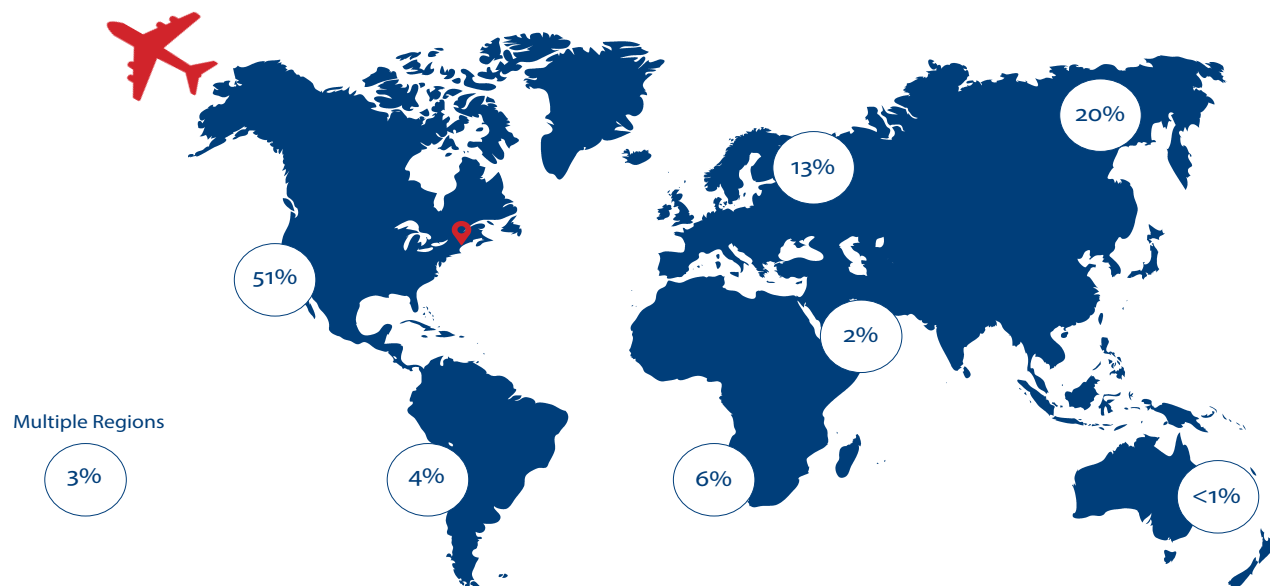
Types of Experiences Funded by Yale Fellowships, 2018–19

Yale Fellowship-Funded Experiences by Region



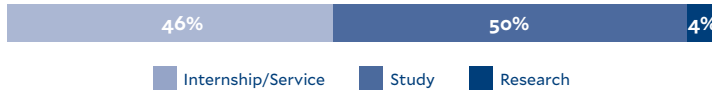

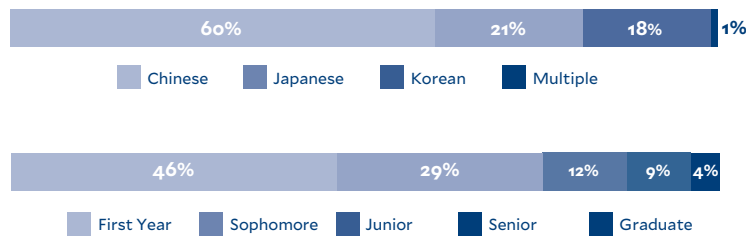

## INTERNATIONAL SUMMER AWARD (ISA)

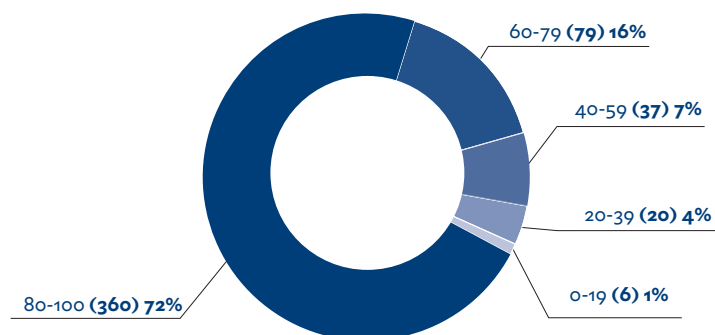

The [Domestic Summer Award](#) provides a stipend for one summer domestic experience for eligible undergraduate students receiving a Yale scholarship. In 2018-19, stipends of \$4,000 each were provided for unpaid or underfunded summer opportunities in the United States with a nonprofit, government entity, arts apprenticeship or a science, laboratory or other research opportunity.

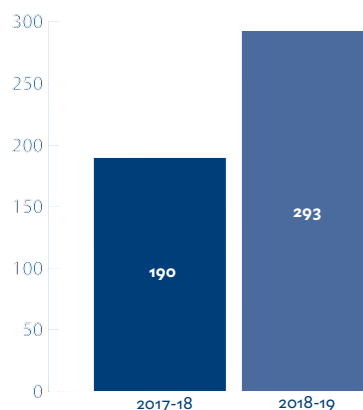
### Domestic Summer Award by Employment Type

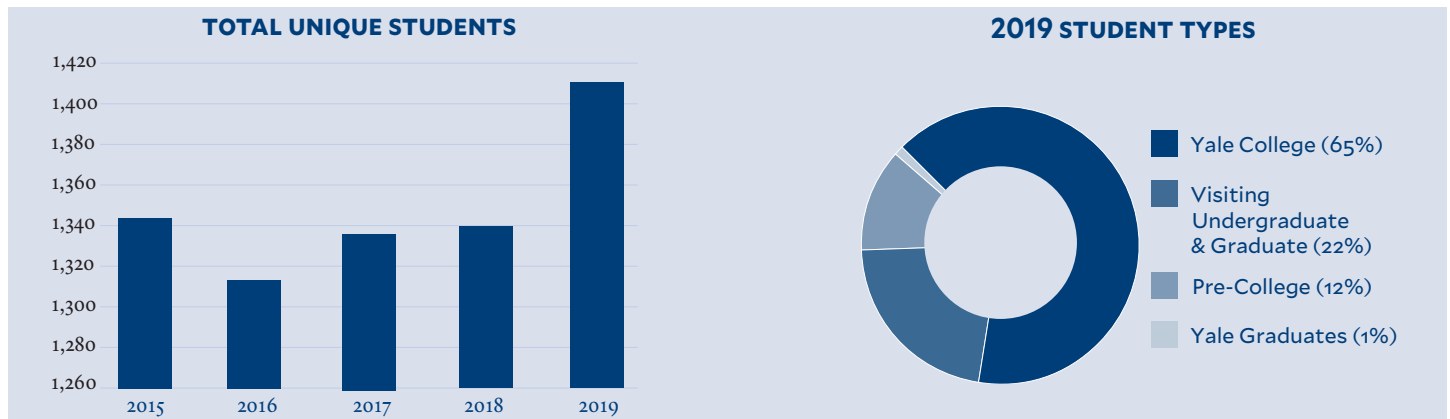

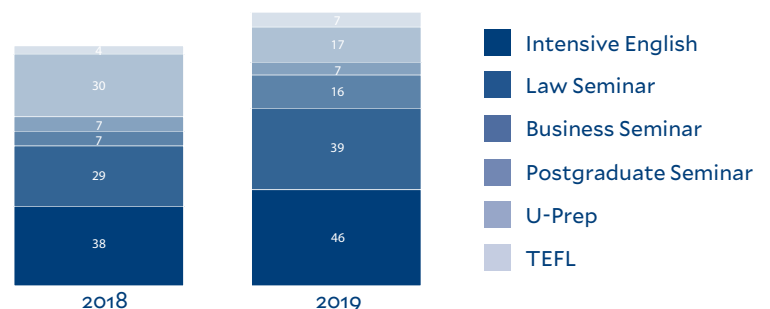
