






Other major national and international awards that Yale students and alumni have won this year include the Beinecke, Kanders Churchill, Luce, and Yenching Academy Scholarships.

INTERNATIONAL SUMMER AWARD (ISA)

The <u>International Summer Award</u> provides a stipend for one summer experience abroad for eligible undergraduate students receiving a Yale scholarship. In 2018-19, the stipend awarded up to \$12,500 in funding for eligible programs, proportional to the need and the cost of the program.

International Summer Award by Level of Need




Types of Experiences Funded by the International Summer Award



DOMESTIC SUMMER AWARD (DSA)

The <u>Domestic Summer Award</u> provides a stipend for one summer domestic experience for eligible undergraduate students receiving a Yale scholarship. In 2018-19, stipends of \$4,000 each were provided for unpaid or underfunded summer opportunities in the United States with a nonprofit, government entity, arts apprenticeship or a science, laboratory or other research opportunity.






Financial Assistance Awarded (including First-Year Scholars)






